Professor Miranda Lou is a seasoned and proven leader in higher education, business and public service. She currently serves as Adjunct Professor at The Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU) Business School, where she contributes her strategic insights and leadership experience to academic development and industry collaboration.

Prior to this, Professor Lou was the Executive Vice President of PolyU, overseeing institutional advancement, mainland development, finance, human resources, knowledge transfer, communications and public affairs, campus development and facilities management, alumni engagement, legal, risk and compliance over her decade of service with the University. She also served as Chairman of PolyU Nanjing and Wenzhou Translational Research Institutes, and Director of Hotel ICON Board and other PolyU's subsidiary companies. Before joining PolyU in 2015, Professor Lou had worked for Wharf (Holdings) Limited and the Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC). She subsequently assumed senior executive positions at the OOCL Group, and her last position at the OOCL Group was the Chief Operating Officer of OOCL Logistics. Her cross-sector experience has equipped her with a broad perspective on strategic management, organizational transformation, governance, and stakeholder engagement.

Professor Lou is currently a member of Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications, the Standing Commission on Disciplined Services Salaries and Conditions of Service, the Advisory Committee on Post-office Employment for Former Chief Executives and Politically Appointed Officials, and the Hong Kong Committee for Pacific Economic Cooperation. She is the Honorary Advisor of the Federation of HK Jiangsu Women Organizations.

Professor Lou has also served as board director of the Logistics and Supply Chain MultiTech R&D Centre, and a member of the Hong Kong Housing Authority, the Standing Commission on Civil Service Salaries and Conditions of Service, and the Insurance Appeals Tribunal.

She holds a Doctor of Business Administration from The Hong Kong Polytechnic University, a Master of Business Administration from The Chinese University of Hong Kong, a Master of Science in Financial Management from the University of London, and a Bachelor of Arts from The University of Hong Kong.
