1. TERMS OF REFERENCE

- 1.1 Based on the Service Agreement (No.: VA2125), the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ), in the capacity of the Accreditation Authority as provided for under the Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications Ordinance (Cap 592) (AAVQO), was commissioned by UOW College Hong Kong (Operator) to conduct a Learning Programme Accreditation (LPA) Exercise with the following Terms of Reference:
- (a) To conduct an accreditation test as provided for in AAVQO to determine whether the following programme of the Operator meets the stated objectives and Hong Kong Qualifications Framework (HKQF, or in short QF) Level 3 standard and can be offered as an accredited programme:
 - (i) Certificate in ESG-Environmental Assessment (Senior Secondary Applied Learning); and
 - (b) To issue to the Operator accreditation report(s) setting out the results of the determination in relation to (a) by HKCAAVQ.
- 1.2 The accreditation exercise was conducted according to the relevant accreditation guidelines referred to in the Service Agreement. A site visit took place on the 26 May 2026.

2. HKCAAVQ'S DETERMINATION

Learning Programme Accreditation

- 2.1 HKCAAVQ has determined that the Certificate in ESG–Environmental Assessment (Senior Secondary Applied Learning) meets the stated objectives and QF standard at Level 3 and can be offered as an accredited programme with a validity period from 1 September 2026 to 31 August 2031.

For the avoidance of doubt, maintenance of accreditation status is subject to fulfilment of any condition and compliance with any restriction stipulated in this Accreditation Report. During the validity period, HKCAAVQ may request the Operator to provide evidence, such as admission related information, to demonstrate that the Operator and the Programme continue to comply with the determinations and meet the relevant accreditation standards.

3. INTRODUCTION

- 3.1 UOW College Hong Kong (UOWCHK), formerly the Community College of City University of Hong Kong (CCCUC), is an educational institution wholly-owned by the University of Wollongong (UOW), Australia. UOWCHK has been registered in Hong Kong as an approved post-secondary college with degree-granting status under the Post-Secondary Colleges Ordinance (Cap. 320), offering a range of academic programmes from Diploma to Bachelor's levels. Besides, UOWCHK and UOW have

been jointly offering non-local top-up degree programmes in Hong Kong leading to UOW awards.

- 3.2 The programme seeking accreditation has been approved by the Education Bureau (EDB) as Applied Learning (ApL) course for senior secondary school students. A differentiation approach is, therefore, adopted in this exercise with a focused scope of review. The Operator is not required to submit documents under Domain of Competence: LPA-2 “Learner Admission and Selection” and LPA-6 “Learning, Teaching and Enabling Resources/Services”.

4. PROGRAMME DETAILS

The following is the programme information provided by the Operator.

4.1 Programme Objectives

This course aims to introduce students to the principles and practices of Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) with a focus on environmental assessment. It seeks to develop students’ awareness of sustainability issues, equip them with practical skills in environmental data collection and analysis, and foster critical thinking through project-based learning. By engaging in real-world applications and field-based activities, students will gain a deeper understanding of how ESG concepts are implemented in local and global contexts.

4.2 Programme Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the programme, learners should be able to:

- PILO1 demonstrate an understanding of the core Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) concepts and the importance of promoting environmental sustainability.
- PILO2 understand key environmental laws and commonly used standards relevant to Hong Kong, and explain their purposes, principles and basic requirements using real-life examples.
- PILO3 conduct a guided environmental site assessment using checklists, simple observations, photos, and basic field records based on specific guidelines.
- PILO4 organise and present environmental data using simple charts or infographics, and interpret basic patterns or trends in writing.
- PILO5 plan and propose a simple ESG-related improvement project, including goals, steps, roles, and expected benefits.
- PILO6 enhance self-understanding and explore directions on further studies and career pursuits.

- This is a Senior Secondary Applied Learning Course. Applicants have to meet the admission requirements set by the EDB.

5. IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING THIS ACCREDITATION REPORT

5.1 Variation and withdrawal of this Accreditation Report

- 5.1.1 This Accreditation Report is issued pursuant to section 5 of the AAVQO, and contains HKCAAVQ's substantive determination regarding the accreditation, including the validity period as well as any conditions and restrictions subject to which the determination is to have effect.
- 5.1.2 HKCAAVQ may subsequently decide to vary or withdraw this Accreditation Report if it is satisfied that any of the grounds set out in section 5 (2) of the AAVQO apply. This includes where HKCAAVQ is satisfied that the Operator is no longer competent to achieve the relevant objectives and/or the Programme no longer meets the standard to achieve the relevant objectives as claimed by the Operator (whether by reference to the Operator's failure to fulfil any conditions and/or comply with any restrictions stipulated in this Accreditation Report or otherwise) or where at any time during the validity period there has/have been substantial change(s) introduced by the Operator after HKCAAVQ has issued the accreditation report(s) to the Operator and which has/have not been approved by HKCAAVQ. - 5.1.3 If HKCAAVQ decides to vary or withdraw this Accreditation Report, it will give the Operator notice of such variation or withdrawal pursuant to section 5(4) of the AAVQO.
- 5.1.4 The accreditation status of the Operator and/or Programme will lapse immediately upon the expiry of the validity period or upon the issuance of a notice of withdrawal of this Accreditation Report.

5.2 Appeals

- 5.2.1 If the Operator is aggrieved by the determination made in this Accreditation Report, then pursuant to Part 3 of the AAVQO the Operator has a right of appeal to the Appeal Board. Any appeal must be lodged within 30 days of the receipt of this Accreditation Report.
- 5.2.2 If the Operator is aggrieved by a decision to vary or withdraw this Accreditation Report, then pursuant to Part 3 of the AAVQO the Operator has a right of appeal to the Appeal Board. Any appeal must be lodged within 30 days of the receipt of the Notice of Variation or Withdrawal.
- 5.2.3 The Operator should be aware that a notice of variation or withdrawal of this Accreditation Report is not itself an accreditation report and the right to appeal

against HKCAAVQ's substantive determination regarding accreditation arises only from this Accreditation Report.

5.3 **Qualifications Register**

- 5.3.1 Qualifications accredited by HKCAAVQ are eligible for entry into the QR at www.hkqr.gov.hk for recognition under the QF. The Operator should apply separately to have their quality-assured qualifications entered into the QR.
- 5.3.2 Only learners who commence the study of the named accredited learning programme during the validity period and who have graduated with the named qualification listed in the QR will be considered to have acquired a qualification recognised under the QF.
